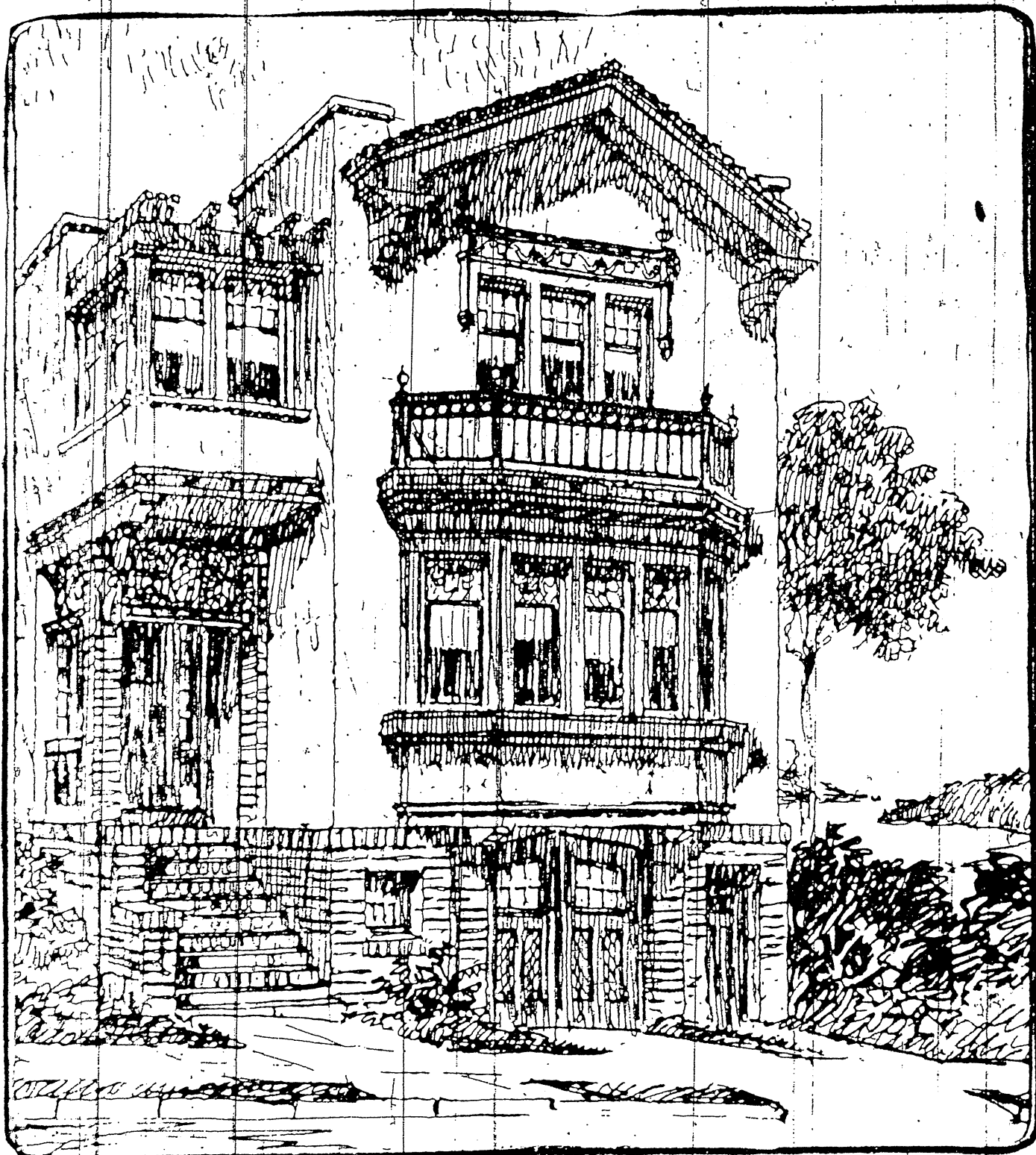


HANDSOME NEW RE

Another beautiful residence is in course of construction in West Clay park. A feature of this house is the sleeping porch with pergola above. The house is designed with a view to artistic effect both in exterior appearance and interior arrangement and finish.

The general style of architecture is Spanish renaissance. The exterior finish is plaster set off with tile roof. The interior appearance will be especially beautiful. The first floor will be in hardwood, selected juniper. This finish will be carried throughout the reception hall, living room and dining room and, combined with the fine tapestry wall coverings and solid bronze fixtures with art shades, will give a most rich and pleasing effect.

The bedrooms will be finished in white enamel with doors in mahogany and wall coverings to harmonize. The bath is to be equipped not only with tub and showers, but will also contain appliances for steam and hot air baths.

In the basement will be furnace, laundry, wine room, and a garage, so arranged as to preserve the style and attractiveness of the front.

This house adds still another architectural style in West Clay park. S. A. Born building company are the builders. Schroeffer & Bolles are the architects.
